English Language Arts


- 4.43% increase in the number of proficient and advanced scholars according to the most recent MAP Data

Tower Grove South Strengths and Weaknesses

- 67% of families commit to our campus from 1st to 8th grade
- Our percent of scholars scoring proficient/advanced is increasing: Math: 2022 (21.15%), 2021 (10%) Reading: 2022 (23.08%), 2021 (20%)
- Retaining qualified staff- through helping them feel supported and valuable in current positions
- Family Events attendance are increasing (1st event 24, 2nd event 45)
- Small school creates tight knit community of scholars and families

- Disproportionality between racial demographics of scholars and staff
- ELL programming for our ELL families especially newcomers.
- Additional programs such as Music courses, World Language, electives and clubs.

TGS Priorities

- 1. Parent Involvement: At least 80% of families will be actively engaged with the school community. As evidenced by attendance at quarterly parent teacher conferences, quarterly family events.
- Academics: At least 50% of scholars will score Proficient or Advanced on the Missouri Assessment Program.
- 1. Attendance: Average Attendance Percentage will be at least 90%
- 1. Staff: 100% instructional positions will be filled with certified staff.



Fox Park Strengths and Weaknesses

- We have diversity on our campus which include: Arabic, Latina, African-American, and Caucasian.
- There is some growth happening in test scores.
- Teachers are provided the opportunity to participate in weekly IP Meetings that address our math priorities.

- Support with helping ELL families fill out enrollment forms would be a plus.
- Lack of consistency for intervention groups is a struggle due to staff shortages and coverages.
- Making sure that teachers have opportunities to grow by offering meaningful and relatable professional development/RTF/ Coaching.

Tower Grove East Strengths and Weaknesses

- TGE has a diverse scholar population. The level of proficiency across all grades and subject.
- Academic data is showing an increase in the growth measures.
- Limited involvement with neighboring businesses.
- Staff are passionate about supporting all scholars, they work hard, and truly care about our mission.
- Barriers with staffing appropriately certified staff and overall teacher staffing is low.

Tower Grove East Priorities

- 1. Increase staffing for the school and hiring appropriately certified staff.
- 2. Increase Parent Engagement
- 3. Increase scholar enrollment numbers
- 4. Increased community involvement



Gravois Park Strengths and Weaknesses

- Close knit community, many of our families and students are connected either by preference or relationship outside of school
- Great teacher retention and growth with individual teachers
- Many students making growth and test scores improving year over year
- Small school helps us with close relationships and be able to be flexible

- Extra support needed for new immigrant families that do not speak English or are behind in academics
- Many students not on grade level
- Shortage of high quality and certified staff
- Need to continue to improve parent communication

Gravois Park Priorities

- 1. Increase academic goals and meeting individual scholar goals
- 2. High quality teacher acquisition and retention
- 3. Improve scholar attendance




